
The rising cost of food has made it necessary for the Estates Banquet Hall to raise the price of the lunch to \$35.00. Please make sure your cheque is made out for this amount.

Eighteen years later, Resa returned to teaching for the Toronto District

School Board where she also conducted and led workshops as a flute specialist for the Toronto Music Camps. In 2000 Resa created Resa's Pieces (Concert Band, Singers and String Ensemble) where adults could "reawaken that talent and rediscover making music" in a fun, social atmosphere.

In 2015 Resa was honoured with an Urban Hero Award, given to people in the community whose personal efforts and contributions have made a significant impact on others.

Along with conducting the Resa's Pieces Concert Band, Resa currently plays flute and piccolo with the North York Concert Band and the Encore Symphonic Band AND is now thrilled to share her love of music with all the dedicated musicians in "The Enchanted Flutes".

If you have a question before you enroll or about your existing coverage, please call Terry Kennedy at 519-583-0098 or Manulife at 1-866-410-0550 (You and your spouse are automatically accepted into The Personal Accidental Death & Dismemberment Plan, regardless of your retirement date). To enroll simply obtain an application from me, Marilyn Hodge, Branch Insurance Convenor, Manulife Financial or Terry Kennedy and mail your completed application in the pre-addressed, postage-paid envelope. I always have the Insurance Brochures on a table close to the entrance to the Banquet Hall.

Just so you know, if you are in the hospital and make a claim for the Comfort Care of \$125.00 per day, you don't need to submit receipts for such items as a television, reading materials or a telephone or anything else that you would like.

At the executive meeting, in September, a question was asked: "What are our membership fees used for that we pay to the province?" Here is the explanation, given by Gloria Drake, Provincial Secretary/Treasurer.

\$10.00 goes back to the Branch for its activities.
The remaining \$30.00 covers:
*Branch visits that the Area Director makes
*Committee and Board expenses are paid
*Gloria Drake's salary, telephone, etc.
There are also some funds that come
from Manulife through the profit-sharing plan which help
to defer some of the costs that come up to run the RWTO organization.

If you turn 71 in 2016 – born in 1945 – you can still get the free shingles vaccine, but you have to

get it no later than December 31, 2016.

Get free shingles vaccine from your family doctor or another primary care provider (e.g. nurse practitioner).
