

A Message From Your Executive ... Because 'Our Members Have Spoken'

In response to suggestions from the membership, we have designed a new method for improving our Table Reservations process., effective immediately.

Please learn about the new process!

New Table Reservations Process

1. When you send your event cheque by the '**due date**', you will be placed on a "**Master List**" of names arranged in *alphabetical order*, with your **table #** next to it.


2. You will then be able to walk to your table and sit at **any available seat**. A table stand/centrepiece will have the names of all table members. There will be a sticker with your table number on your name tag, as a reminder.
3. You require only one person to '**reserve a group table.**' However, each person in the group must send in her cheque, so that it arrives two weeks before the event. (You may continue to pay at any event for the next one, or may pay for several in advance.) Group reservations may be made for 2 to 8 people.
4. Any paid member who does not request a table reservation to sit with friends by the due date, *will be offered an available seat.*

Bernice and Helen have been long time members of RWTO. Bernice taught elementary inner city children for twenty years with the Catholic Board, and then spent eleven as a High School *'restaurant hospitality'* teacher, which she says, 'was fun'. Helen Bida, co-leader and her dear friend since 'babyhood', taught elementary and then *itinerant music*. They've shared many things including their love and rescuing of cats, travelling the globe together,... and taking a *fashion design* course at Mohawk College, to be able to sew well-fitting clothing for themselves. Bernice always loved sweaters, and once took a course in *'Fairisle Knitting'*, and the rest as she says 'is history'. Together they joined RWTO's 'Knitting and Crocheting' group, and eventually took over its leadership. With several assistants, Helen, who loves to crochet, continues to make the quilt borders, while Bernice knits.

Here are some facts you may not know:

- 1 quilt = approx. 48 squares
 - takes approx. 96 hours to knit, 10 hours to join together, and 2 hours to crochet the border, which equals = approx. 108-110 hours to make 1 quilt
 - In July: 22 afghans were given to *'Interval House'*, a Woman's shelter
 - 14-15 afghans given to the *'Out of the Cold'* program
 - Last year: 15-16 blankets were donated to the Police Dept's *"Child Abuse and First Responders"*, for victims of fire, or child abuse
 - Every Christmas at Liuna, an afghan will be raffled off with the money going to our Branch's Christmas children's outreach
 - All afghans have handmade labels: *"Handmade by Retired Women Teachers of Ontario, Hamilton-Wentworth"*

INSPIRING MEMBERS



Marion Jutzi is a long time member of the Retired Women Teachers of Ontario, Hamilton-Wentworth Branch, and the dedicated hard working *Membership Convenor* on our Branch's Executive. Retired since 1973, she taught for seven years for the Dundas Board and the Waterloo Board, where her daughter Heather now teaches. She has three married children, and eleven grandchildren who add much joy to her life. While her children were in school, she used her *sewing talents* to create and make gymnastic body suits for 3 clubs and 5 high schools. At this time she had two other women who came to her home to cut and sew. Marion's creative talents didn't stop there. Marion

started to use beads in her *embroidery designs*, and took a design course at Sheridan to further her techniques. In 1980, she says,... "the only place you could buy a variety of beads was at the dressmaker's supply in Toronto." In 2000, she and three women friends decided to open a bead store of their own because "we couldn't get the high quality Japanese beads we wanted for our bead designs." At her store, she used her *teaching skills* to teach classes, and fortunately for us,... an *RWTO beading interest group* was later formed by Marion to share her love of beading with others. Her designs were beautiful, and many of our members were fortunate enough to participate, and make their own creations. This summer,... during July and August 2016, seven of her lovely *beadwork designs* were hung in a show at the *Ingersoll Centre for Creative Arts*. Marion certainly is a talented, enterprising, and inspiring lady! Best wishes, and congratulations from all your friends and colleagues in RWTO!




Art Gallery of Ontario: Exhibit: Group of Seven Painter, Lawren Harris

We are planning to travel by Go train to TO to see an exhibit organized and arranged by comedian Steve Martin based on the works of Group of Seven Painter, Lawren Harris. Typically we take an early Go Train around 9:00 and have lunch at a

The Idea of North: The Paintings of Lawren Harris

A founding member of the Group of Seven and a major figure in the history of twentieth-century Canadian art, Lawren Harris (1885-1970) remains largely unknown in the United States. This year the AGO is partnering with the Hammer Museum to introduce Harris's iconic landscapes to audiences in Los Angeles and Boston. *The Idea of North: The Paintings of Lawren Harris* will be the first major solo exhibition of his work to be shown in the United States, and will arrive in Toronto in July of 2016.

The exhibition is curated by comedian, musician, actor and writer Steve Martin in collaboration with Cynthia Burlingham, Deputy Director, Curatorial Affairs at the Hammer Museum, and Andrew Hunter, Fredrik S. Eaton Curator of Canadian Art at the AGO.

The core of the exhibition features more than 30 of Harris' most significant and rare northern landscapes from the 1920s and 1930s, drawn from major public and private collections across Canada including the AGO, the Thomson Collection of Canadian Art at the AGO, the National Gallery of Canada and the McMichael Canadian Art Collection.

The AGO's installation offers an expanded experience, curated by Hunter. It opens with a selection of Harris' early paintings from the 1910s, many of which depict the complex and culturally diverse Ward neighbourhood in Toronto, where the artist spent his formative years. Visitors will then experience the core of the exhibition, followed by a special epilogue that explores the influence of Harris' landscapes on Canadian identity ("the idea of north") in relation to the city. The impact of Harris' art and legacy can be seen through historical photographs by Arthur Goss in addition to the works of several contemporary Canadian artists including Nina Bunjevac, Jennifer Baichwal and Nick de Pencier, Tin Can Forest and Anique Jordan. Combined with the core exhibition, this enhanced presentation of *The Idea of North* features over 80 works in total.

Ken Danby (1940-2007)



Ken Danby was one of Canada's foremost artists; a painter and printmaker of international renown best known for his realist style.

Danby's subject matter ranged widely, but it was his images of Canadian landscapes and life that captured the public's attention; like "At the Crease", the 1972 egg tempera painting depicting a nameless hockey goalie viewed from ice-level defending his net.



Danby's works are owned by private collectors worldwide, as well as by many institutions, including The National Gallery of Canada in Ottawa, The Art Institute of Chicago, The Museum of Modern Art in New York and the Montreal Museum of Fine Art.




