Sleeping Children Around the World - SCAW - Brenda McGinnis

As you know, for many years, Guelph Wellington Retired Women Teachers has had the Christmas tradition of buying bed kits for Sleeping Children Around the World. (SCAW). The on-going threat of COVID19 has caused us to cancel our usual Christmas celebration luncheon but our executive would like to continue this long-standing tradition of supporting SCAW.


Last year, despite not having a Christmas luncheon, we collected \$6535.00 for SCAW. They were delighted! In fact, since 2012, we have collected \$86,605.00 for SCAW. At this time, based on the current Canadian government travel advisories, SCAW has postponed all upcoming bed kit distributions.

BUT, if you donate to SCAW, your official tax receipt will be issued in the usual time frame. The mailing of the photos of the children who will receive your donated bed kits will be delayed until they are able to resume bed kit distribution. SCAW, which has an excellent reputation in the world of charities, guarantees that 100% of your bed kit donations will be held securely until they are able to distribute the bed kits safely.

Our executive hopes that you will once again consider donating to SCAW this year. If you are interested, you can follow these easy steps.

- 1) Decide how many bed kits you would like to donate. Bed kits cost \$35. each.
- 2) For income tax purposes, write down your name and address. Tax receipts will be mailed to you at this address.
- 3) Decide if you wish to make a special occasion bed kit donation e.g., Christmas, In Memoriam, retirement, birthday, graduation, anniversary, etc.
- 4) Each picture of a child with a bed kit has a label. Write what you want the label in your picture to read.

 Some examples:



Note: For each label, there can be a maximum of 4 lines of text with 15 characters per line.

5) If you wish to have some or all of your pictures sent to a different address than your own, the one where the tax receipt will be sent, print the full name and address for each picture recipient.

So, if you want Patricia to receive the photo with the label, write down Patricia's address and the photo will be sent to her once the volunteers can safely deliver the bed kits.

All special occasion donations will have an acknowledgement card sent to the picture recipient within a few weeks. The pictures will follow as soon as possible.


It would be wonderful if, in spite of the pandemic, we could continue our generous support of this worthwhile cause. These bed kits will probably be needed more than ever in 2022.
