Everything You Need To Know About K.I.T.



And, if he or she charges you a fee to complete the Attending Physician Statement of the Claim Form; you can submit a receipt for that charge and be reimbursed up to \$50 under the Physician Valuation Expense benefit.

This was the flavour of our 3 days in Brantford, Ontario for the 69th RWTO/OERO AGM Convention.

Being my first experience, I had no idea what to expect. My overall perspective is that the conference is twofold. The main objective was to accomplish the business aspect of RWTO/OERO and to pass the reigns to the new executive of 2026. Issues and Concerns

At the AGM, RWTO Executive received a pamphlet titled 2025 Position Paper — "Transformation of the "Women's World" in Long-Term Care Facilities to Home-Like Settings". This was prepared by the Retired Women Teachers of Ontario and researched by the Social Justice Committee. All the information found in the prepared pamphlet is the property of RWTO and the Social Justice Committee. The information gives an understanding of the words, ideas, research, direction, and the urgent need for change due to the Canadian statistics on Women in LTC. It includes detailed solutions on new training for staff, the need to create a home atmosphere of participation, and a caring humanized environment. The 2025 Position Paper points out that the Canadian Government will also be needed to be part of the equation in creating important changes. There are also some direct questions included in the Position Paper to encourage action from the Decision-Makers. In reading the information in the pamphlet the one part that spoke strongly to me is that we build someone up, spend some time, let them know they are valued, welcomed, and listened to.
