Basic Soft Icing

2 lb icing sugar
½ tsp salt
½ lb shortening or white margarine
2 tsp. clear vanilla
½ tsp. almond flavour
½ cup milk powder or ¼ cup coffee mate
Water (2/3 to 1 cup)

Mix the milk powder with <u>some</u> of the water to totally dissolve. Cream shortening <u>well</u>, add salt, a little icing sugar, vanilla and almond flavouring.

Mix well.

Alternate adding liquid and icing sugar until well blended.

Upcoming Events - Cards

 Small double-sided cards (6 or 8 to a sheet of cardstock) are given out at each luncheon with the dates and locations listed for upcoming luncheons ... on the back is a list of "Benefits of Being a Member of Haldimand RWTO/OERO"

"Be Our Guest Cards"

 These are used for a draw at luncheons - one member who wears their RWTO/OERO pin receives a free luncheon coupon for the next event

"Touch" Lap Quilts

- ◆ The quilts created by a group of members have segments and attachments with various textures
- They are given to members (or someone in their family) having memory difficulties or recovering from cancer and other surgeries
- ♦ They are delivered in person for a special social visit

5. Hamilton-Wentworth Branch

Project Baby Snuggle

- ◆ A crocheted baby blanket created by a Branch member, a board book and a booklet about the importance of reading to babies and preschoolers are given to young mothers who are also trying to finish their high school diplomas (through a local charity and Board of Education project)

Drive By Charity

- ◆ Pick a public spot, like a grocery store parking lot with their permission, and advertise, advertise, advertise using local newspapers, TV, radio, social media, church messages etc.
- ◆ Define the list of items you are collecting, so you don't get everything including the kitchen sink
- ♦ Use a different car trunk for each charity
- Have extra cars available some make several trips
- ♦ Lots of helpers make sorting easier
- ♦ Don't forget the sunscreen and some music

Cupcake Creation Event

- Prepare enough cupcakes for each of your participants to have at least a couple – perhaps one to eat, and one to share (and a few for later?)
- Prepare icing in advance for decorating, in a variety of colours
- Be prepared with icing tubes & tips, bowls, spatulas, and other implements for icing the cupcakes – perhaps you need some plastic table covers, and clean-up items
- ♦ Here are 2 icing recipes we used:

Boiled Flour Icing

This is a not too sweet icing that can be used for anything. It takes time to make, so plan ahead, perhaps doubling or tripling the recipe to store in the fridge until needed. You can colour or flavour it (add baking cocoa to make chocolate). It is great for squares, as they are sweet enough already. Good in jelly rolls and whoopie pies also.

3 tbsp. flour ½ tsp. salt 1 cup milk

Cook in a small saucepan until thickened, <u>stirring constantly</u>. Cool to room temperature.

1 cup butter or shortening, softened

1 cup white or brown sugar

2 tsp. vanilla, white or regular

In a large mixing bowl, cream butter/shortening and sugar until very light and fluffy.

Add flour mixture and beat for 10-15 minutes – really!

This icing can be kept in the fridge for several weeks, then bring it to room temperature for easier spreading.

Separate portions for adding colour or flavour if desired (either before or after being refrigerated).

9. Ottawa Carleton Branch

Stirring Up Memories Cookbook

- ◆ There were lots of stories about how food became a focus for people as they dealt with the pandemic
- ◆ To give members something to think about, the Branch created their own cookbook which was also a memoir of this unusual time
- Members submitted recipes that may have been a family favourite handed down through the ages, a special comfort food that had meaning for them, or a dish that became special in their lives at this time
- Many recipes were accompanied by a little story about how or why this recipe was sent in for the cookbook

Connecting with Members

- ◆ 4 newsletters a year, 2 of which contained a special "Covid Tales" column, with members contributing stories and photos of their activities during the pandemic – about 20% of the membership participated
- Greeting cards for celebrations, some with packets of hot chocolate or tea

10. Palmerston Branch

Chuckles the Clown – event entertainment

◆ Find your branch event entertainment locally – perhaps those possessing unusual talents, (such as a young teen who had mastered making balloon creations, such as reindeer and Santas, to the joy of our members ... who got to take one home)

Photo Frame Idea for Events

◆ Decorate a large – but lightweight – artwork frame with decor of the season, and use it to highlight groups of your members at seasonal events – great fun

Soles4Souls

- ◆ Did you know that in some countries, children cannot attend school unless they wear shoes
- ◆ Great for a drive by charity event or a luncheon
- ♦ Clean out your closet and donate gently used shoes
- An international charity that is available in most areas of the province for donations
- provide shoes for disaster relief and to those in need in Canada and around the world
- Drop off your donations at some local shoe stores and orthopaedic centres, after contacting them (check the website for participants- e.g. Ardene, Bioped, DSW, Foot Locker)
- Donate shoes and boots of all kinds keep them out of landfills; they even take single shoes
- Put an elastic band around each pair, or ties laces together

Special Outreach Project

- Using a set of criteria, once a year, a deserving local person, family, or cause, submitted by one of our members, receives a one-time donation of \$500 to help offset their financial needs

6. Napanee Branch

Tales for Tots

- Since 2005 every newborn in Lennox and Addington County has received a kit of early learning materials containing two board books, a CD of music, a booklet of songs and finger plays, and various pamphlets promoting early literacy skills
- ◆ These kits have been packaged by our members after our meetings and delivered by public health nurses
- ◆ Each baby receives one of these gifts to help give them a good start in listening. talking and singing
- Our hope is that by providing these early learning kits to new mothers, children who might not otherwise be exposed to reading materials before they enter kindergarten will now have that opportunity.
- ♦ Over 2200 kits have been distributed to date

Caring & Sharing

- A Christmas package was personally provided to each member, which included a mask, teabag, chocolate, a candy cane, homemade jam, and Christmas serviettes
- ◆ A letter wishing everyone a safe and joyous Christmas was included
- ◆ The organizers were very gratified by the way these gifts were received
- Also, members sponsored a fundraising walkathon for a local hospice

7. Niagara Falls Branch

Pencil Cases for Kids

- Members donated funds to the United Way to purchase school supplies, as they could get bulk pricing for items
- Members then helped pack the pencil cases for school children, that were given out discretely by school principals
- Pencil cases included gift cards, so children could purchase a backpack that suited their personality
- ◆ This project also provided an excellent media story, which promoted both the local Branch and the Provincial organization
