Continuing from the book Dear Teacher

Optimism followed. The boys were back, the war was over, a new world was being born. Its name? The Roaring Twenties!

On the political scene, farmers and workers were organizing. Canadian women now had the right to vote and in 1920 an Ontario country school teacher called Agnes Macphail became Canada's first woman Member of Parliament.

These were boom years: jazz, motor cars, prohibition, strange new politics, movies. But the frantic activity and optimism were all swallowed up in 1929 with the stock market crash. The roaring twenties became the dirty thirties.

By 1931, millions were out of work all over the world. In Ontario, teachers' salaries were tumbling and desperate teachers were underbidding to get jobs. A 1935 survey showed that sixty-one per cent of new Normal School graduates had no jobs.

The Ottawa Women Teacher's Association gave money to buy shoes for Ottawa School children and Toronto's women teachers gave one per cent of their salaries for assistance to the city's single, unemployed women.

And the rest of Canada rallied to help the West, where disastrous crop failures and year after year of dust and hunger turned the Depression years into the Dirty Thirties.
