Our <u>Start-up Tool Kit</u> with its <u>Planning Guide</u> and <u>Directory of Retirement</u> <u>and LTC Homes</u> not only provides information on community resources, supports, and services but also how to access them privately or through an Ontario Health atHome Care Coordinator.

- a. The <u>Continuum of Care Start-up Planning Guide</u> indicates a continuum in which healthcare needs may increase as we age while our independence decreases.
- b. The <u>Directory of Retirement and LTC Homes</u> encourages a quick reference to Homes in 12 Centres across Niagara.

The following Task Summary may be helpful to any RWTO/OERO Branch interested in adapting our Start-up Tool Kit.

- 1. Strike a small committee responsible for Issues and Concerns. St. Catharines Convenor chaired this committee.
- 2. Identify Retirement and LTC Homes in your particular Branch area.

- b. https://ontariohealthathome.ca Click on Find Your Local Branch: Click on top row for Long-Term Care; Choose Retirement Homes or Long-Term Care Homes.
- c. www.ontario.ca/longtermcare
 Click on Choosing a Long-Term Care Home. Search for Homes (LTC).
- 3. Create a list of **LTC Homes** in your particular Branch Area organized by the following categories (for posting to your Branch Website):
 - Regional / Municipal owned and operated;
 - Non-Profit owned and operated;
 - For Profit owned and operated.
- 4. Create a list of **Retirement Homes** in your particular Branch area including phone numbers and addresses, for posting to your Branch website.
- 5. Create a single-page <u>Directory of Retirement and LTC Homes</u> including **only** phone numbers. List both types of Homes according to major Centres in your particular Branch area.
- 6. Arrange for Committee members to visit several Retirement and LTC Homes. See **Checklist** on Back of **Continuum of Care Start-up Planning Guide**.
 - * Note: Look for Homes trying to change from institutions to "home-like" venues e.g. Butterfly Approach. See www.meaningfulcarematter.com.
- 7. Create a sample list of local Care providers, Support Services, privately for hire for a fee, as included in the **Start-up Planning Guide**.
- 8. Assemble the **Start-up Tool Kit** using the template provided including:
 - a. a half-fold colour Continuum of Care Start-up Planning Guide
 - b. a single sheet <u>Directory of Retirement and LTC Homes</u> with only telephone numbers. Consider posting addresses/details or links to Homes on your Branch website.
- 9. Obtain estimates for the printing costs for two-sided colour copies of the <u>Start-up Planning Guide</u> and the separate single sheet <u>Directory of Retirement and LTC Homes</u> in your area. It is suggested that you include one hard copy per member plus additional to have available depending on the size of your branch. Post on your Branch Website.
- 10. Present the <u>Start-up Tool Kit</u> <u>Planning Guide</u> and <u>Directory of Retirement and LTC Homes</u>, printing estimates, distribution options and methods, to the Executive.
