It was a busy spring for our branch with our April luncheon being held at a venue new to us - Club Italia in Niagara Falls. Following the informative presentation by Sarah Putman from the Alzheimer's Society of Niagara, we enjoyed a delicious Italian lunch. We also honoured our very deserving 2025 Cora Bailey recipient, Linda Gaudet. In May we held our Annual General Meeting and luncheon at Betty's in Chippawa...another first for us, and our members expressed an interest in coming back. We celebrated the lives of those who had passed this year with a lovely In Memoriam Service prepared by Sharon Martinello and delivered by President, Melanie Kelch. Linda Gaudet, Nomination Chair, conducted the election providing us with our new executive for 2025-26.

In June, our branch delegates, Melanie Kelch, Judith Bennoch, Violette Hagerty, Susan McLaughlin, Kathleen

Bradley, Linda Foster and Clara Warden, attended the 69th AGM/Convention held in Brandford. The highlight for us was our branch being honoured with *The Feather in Your Hat* **Award.** This award is given to branches who involve many members of their branch to support their community in a unique way. Myself and Melanie Kelch, President, submitted an entry based on the development of the **Continuum of**

Care Tool Kit. This

project was led by Marg Newby and the Issues and Concerns Committee, with graphic work provided by Violette Hagerty. If you recall, this Tool Kit was



presented and shared with our members at our September luncheon last year and sent out to all members who were not in attendance. As well, this project was shared with members of the Provincial Board and at a workshop later in the fall for members across the province. It clearly met the criteria of the award. Violette Hagerty and Melanie Kelch, our President, accepted the award on behalf of the committee.

The AGM at Convention dealt with a number of Resolutions which I highlighted for you at our luncheon in May. The Resolution to increase delegates to two for all branches with less than 100 members was passed. Subsequently, the majority of the rest of the Resolutions related to this decision were passed in order to have the Constitution and Policy and Procedures document reflect this decision. The only other Resolution of particular interest, suggested to open our membership to teachers who have not yet retired. A type of Social/Associate member who would attend when they could and possibly be encouraged to become full members when they retire. As there were issues with the terminology this Resolution was deferred and will likely be brought up again another year.

Finally, it was necessary for the Provincial Board to pass a deficit budget for 2025-2026. Although the reserve funds are quite healthy, they are still below the recommended levels. It was pointed out that this may mean an additional increase in membership fees in the future.

In closing, I would also like to acknowledge and thank member Patti Malkiewich, who took on the role of Area 13 Director on the Provincial Board in May. Patti has also taken on the Sales and Materials role as well. Congratulations and again - thank you for stepping up!!

September will bring a new Membership Year - a special one - our 70th Jubilee - and we are looking at celebrating in a big way next spring!!! Stayed tuned.

Insurance Report: Susan McLaughlin, Insurance Convenor

The Manulife Hospital and Home Care Plan is an affordable extra insurance plan that gives peace of mind during a convalescence from a hospital stay. It costs \$14.95 a month for a member and \$15.57 for a partner. You can enroll in the plan

in the first year after you retire without a medical questionnaire to be filled in by your doctor. After your first year of retirement, you are required to send in a medical questionnaire to obtain approval to join. All the information on what the plan covers can be found on the RWTO website, https://rwto.org or you can ask Susan McLaughlin for a brochure.

For those of you who already have the plan, remember that you have a year to submit your claim. If you stop your membership with RWTO, your plan will become invalid, and it is up to you to call and cancel it. The same applies if you move into a home that gives you medical assistance. If you have questions give me a call.




An Afternoon Tea will be offered, probably in October. Watch for this in the October newsletter.
