### **Recruitment** ...... sharing successful practices

Adopt 'Each One Bring One' - as branch motto

'Be Our Guest' Membership Drive - include creative Interest Group displays, food and fellowship-

**Communications or Publicity Convenor** - remember to regularly send updates to be posted on your branch website, including updates to information, photos etc.

*Did you know?* – RWTO/OERO has a display at the *ETFO Annual Meeting* in Toronto each August – thank you Carol Nelson and volunteers

Display - if possible and as permitted, have a display at any Ladies Night in your community

Education Week - as possible, take treats to local schools showing support and sharing info about RWTO/OERO

Existing Membership - ongoing encouragement for members to bring a friend, contact known retired teachers, etc

Extend a Personal Invitation - by letter to prospective members

Fall Fairs - have a table with your information on display

Gift wrapping at a local mall - the charity's sign will identify your group

**Goodwill Convenor and Executive members** - pay attention to members as they deal with family circumstances that necessitate moving in and out of membership

Greeters - have a greeter at each meeting to make newcomers feel comfortable and welcome

Invite a retired teacher friend - to join you for an excursion, event, etc. with branch members

*Invite newly retired teachers or newcomers to community* - for a free breakfast, coffee hour, luncheon etc and follow up with a personal phone call

Invite Photographer - having a special meeting? - invite a local newspaper photographer

Lapsed members - contact all and personally invite back

**Local newspapers** - publicize your branch events, charitable activities, and share branch contact information in your local newspaper(s) on a regular basis

Meet and Greet - host a Meet and Greet event at a venue of your choice, such as Muffins and Mimosas

**Membership** - include this position on your executive and consider a committee to work with her to connect with ETFO, OECTA, OSSTF and local school boards.... as possible
